Greetings, Fellow Veterans of the Geodetic Survey Squadron/Geodetic Survey Group!

We'll take a comfortable four days to get there from the Virginia side of Washington, DC, but we plan to arrive a day or two early to make sure all things are lined up as planned and ready for all to have a great time.

Reunion Details

Turnout for this reunion is slightly lighter than previous reunions. As I write, **95** of us have already reserved our places at the reunion, and many have signed up for all three catered events. Here's the breakout so far. I don't expect these numbers to change significantly.

If you have not made your hotel reservations yet, you have missed the 20 July deadline for getting the special room rate. As reported here in the last several newsletters, any unreserved rooms after 20 July have reverted to the regular price and are available to reunion attendees only on a space-available basis. Likewise, the hotel will now require a \$5 surcharge for anyone wanting to pay at the door for the three catered events.

The three catered events include a Friday evening "Icebreaker" social, Saturday mid-day luncheon and Sunday late-morning brunch, 3-5 August 2012.

Another GSS Vet Recently Deceased

I recently got sad word from **Ed Finke** that another of our former colleagues passed away last January. Here's the news directly from Ed:

This may be old news, but **Edgar "Ed" Rosser**, age 68 of Dorcas, WV, died 20 Jan 2011 at the Grant Memorial Hospital in Petersburg, WV. He was in Field Survey in 1964-1967 with **Ed Fincke, Herb Guenther and Joe Noel**, in Orlando and Cheyenne WY. - Ed Fincke, GSS, 1963-1967

This was particularly sad news for me, as I remember Rosser very well. After basic training at Lackland, I went through the Topographic Surveyor course (as the Army Engineer School then called it) at Ft Belvoir in early 1964 with all three of the men mentioned by Ed Finke--Guenther, Noel and Rosser. I recall that they all got orders for Orlando when the course was over, but I was sent to a Civil Engineering Group at Andrews AFB on the Maryland side of Washington. (I lived in the barracks right across from the hangar where Air Force One was parked.) A few years later, after the 1381st had moved Hq from Orlando to Cheyenne, I met up with them again. I got orders to the Squadron and FEW in 1967. They all got out later that year when their enlistments expired. Herb went on to serve the citizens of Arizona and became a state representative and senator there and an able advocate for water conservation. Rosser did not have e-mail, but Herb and Joe have been on our e-mail distribution list for reunions. Regrettably, none of them has ever made it to a reunion. Recently, my e-mails to Joe have bounced, due no doubt to a change in Internet service providers. (That's why it's so important for us to have your full contact information!) I hope they are aware of Ed Rosser's passing, and that they will soon be in contact with us over the loss of their old friend and survey colleague. (Send us your updated contact info, guys!)

Rest in peace, Ed Rosser. May you end up in your next life, as you often liked to say in this life, flashing a grin and a twinkle, and in your best West Virginia drawl, "Ah'm fine, fine, finer than a frog's hair!"
